#### BEYOND BRAVERY: POLAND IN WORLD WAR II —

Learn more about the amazing story of this forgotten Western Ally.

Poland was the first of the Allies to fight Hitler. It was the only Ally invaded and occupied by two enemies (Germany and the Soviet Union). But unlike France, Poland never surrendered.

Poland continued to fight the enemy both within the country and throughout Europe as one of the Allies.

Inside the country, the Polish government-in-exile ran the largest non-communist resistance organization in occupied Europe, while outside the country it fielded the fourth largest Allied military force in the European Theater of the war (and during the most desperate year of the war—from June 1940 when France surrendered, to June 1941 when Germany invaded the Soviet Union—Poland was Britain's largest ally).

In September 1940, Captain Witold Pilecki volunteered to get himself arrested and sent to Auschwitz as a prisoner, in order to smuggle out intelligence and build a resistance organization among the prisoners. Barely surviving nearly three years of brutality, disease and starvation, Pilecki carried out his mission before escaping.



#### THE ICE ROAD: AN EPIC JOURNEY —

Explore a little-known aspect of World War II.

In September 1939, Poland became the only Ally invaded and occupied by two enemies: Germany from the west and the Soviet Union from the east.


Beginning in February 1940, the Soviets deported 1.5 million innocent Polish civilians to forced labor camps in the frozen wastes of Siberia and elsewhere in the Soviet Union. A year later, in June 1941, Hitler turned on his erstwhile ally Stalin, and invaded the Soviet Union. As a result, the Soviet Union joined the Allies, "freeing" the surviving Polish civilians and prisoners of war to join a newly formed Polish army under General Władysław Anders.

Based on the experiences of teenager Stefan Waydenfeld as detailed in his award-winning book *The Ice Road: An Epic Journey from the Stalinist Labor Camps to Freedom*—surviving the frozen arctic forests while working on the

"ice road" to transport logs, escape by river on a raft, chaotic travel by rail and on foot through Central Asia, Kazakhstan and Persia to finally join the Polish II Corps of General Władysław Anders and continue the fight against the Germans.

What happens after the shooting and bombing stop, after "peace" returns ... and there is no home to return to?


